1) INTRODUCTION

Hon'ble Dr.K.S.Chougule Founder President of Dnyanganga Shikshan Prasarak Mandal, Malwadi. Tal-Panhala,Dist-Kolhapur, established Shripatrao Chougule Arts and Commerce College, Malwadi-Kotoli, on 1st June 1998 to open the door of higher education for rural youth specially for girls.Due to need of the science wing the institution started science wing in the year 2016, hence the name of the college is changed into Shripatrao Chougule Arts and Science College, Malwadi-Kotoli.

This college is affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The mission and goals of the college is to educate the rural youth in adjacent villages of Kotoli and to develop their personality to take active participation in developing India.

College was reaccredited by NAAC in March 2012 and was awarded 'B' Grade.

The Gender Audit is an attempt to study good gender balance, the college follows all the University rules and policies. The Gender Audit tries to check the impact of its current and proposed policies on gender equality.

The college tries to create a safe, social and physical environment that helps all students to learn and succeed in healthy atmosphere. The college plays an important role in the career and personality development of all students and promotes sustained quality education to make the students courageous and competent.

The college provides various facilities to the girl students for gender equality. The NSS unit has 100 intake capacity out of which 60% are girls. The NSS Unit always motivates the girls for their social responsibilities and their empowerment. The college provides separate study room, rest room, drinking water facility and separate toilet to the girls. To make the girls aware of their rights and to impart knowledge of by-laws, lectures of legal experts (lawyers)

are arranged. These lectures are arranged every year by Internal Complaints Committee, Sexual Harassment, Prevention, Prohibition and redressal at Work Place Committee and Anti-Ragging Committee for women. In the cultural activities and sports girls have achieved grand success. H. B. checkup camp is arranged for girls. Their active participation in cultural programmes, youth festival, various competitions show their ability and achievement. In order to give girl students the information about the development in different areas regarding women, we have subscribed to "Milun Saryajani" magazine.

2)Objectives of Gender Audit

Gender Audit of Shripatrao Chougule Arts and Science College, Malwadi-Kotoli, Tal-Panhala has the following objectives.

- 1. To find out the gender ratio existence in different areas and factors behind the gender balance.
- 2. To examine the policies, and actions of the college towards male-female equality.
- 3. To establish good gender balance in decision making processes in all areas of the college activities.
- 4. To recommend measures for reducing the gender gap.
- 5. To increase gender equality in all aspects.
- 6. To show the measures for prevention and prohibition of sexual harassment at work place.

3) Gender Sensitive Characteristics in Shripatrao Chougule Arts and Science College, Malwadi-Kotoli, Tal-Panhala.

In each aspect gender sensitive characteristics are carefully observed .Gender equality is kept update by forming various committees like Anti-Ragging Committee, Internal Women Complaints Committee, Sexual Harassment (Prevention Prohibition and Redressal) of Woman at Work Place Committee and rendering adequate facilities for girls.

- 1] **Study Room** Separate Study Room near Library leads to excellent performance of girls.
- 2] Ladies Room and Wash Room:-Ladies Room is provided to the girl students for resting. Wash room is there with ample water supply and daily cleaning. A separate notice board is placed in ladies room. Woman faculty members try to solve issues related to the girls, sanitary napkins if necessary are provided to the girls. A separate wash room is provided to women faculty members.
- 3] **Canteen facility** Canteen facility is available for faculty members and students with separate seating arrangement for girls.
- 4] **Drinking water** A separate drinking water facility is available for girl students.
- 5] **Health camp** Health camps are arranged to check HB level in girl students and Blood donation camps are arranged by NSS and gender audit committee.
- 6] **Discipline committee** Collage has formed Discipline Committee. There are five members in the committee among them there are two female members.
- 7] **Anti- Ragging Committee**-College is affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The college is constituent part of Shivaji University, Kolhapur. Some of its responsibilities are shared and covered by joint arrangement. The college publishes its regulations in prospectus. Ragging is criminal offence and UGC has notified Regulation as curbing the means of ragging in higher educational institutions in order to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging. The college has formed Anti- Ragging Committee. The committee comprises of one female parent, one LMC member, one social worker and the principal of the college.
- 8] **NSS Unit** In the NSS unit of the college there are 100 volunteers among them there are 60% girl volunteers every year. The NSS unit arranges 7 days camp in different villages. In 2013- 14 the 6 volunteers participated in the workshop organized by the Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The NSS unit organized rally for "Lek Vachava Abhiyan" in Kotoli and also arranged tree plantation programme. Health checkup camp was arranged at college and 10 volunteers participated in University Camp in the year 2014-15.




Fig 1. Year wise Gender Comparison




Fig 2. Gender comparison in Social Category 2013-14




Fig 3. Gender comparison in Social Category 2014-15




Fig 4.Gender comparison in Social Category 2015-16




Fig 5.Gender comparison in Social Category 2016-17




Fig 6. Gender comparison in Social Category 2017-18




Fig-7.GENDER CALSSFICATION OF NON-TEACHING STAFF




Fig 8. Gender Difference in teaching Faculty




Fig 9- Gender wise classification of NSS volunteers




Fig 10- Faculty wise gender comparison




Fig. 11-Faculty wise gender comparison2017-18




Fig 12-GENDER WISE THE LIST OF STUDENT – WHO GET SCOLERSHIP

5] Prevention Of sexual Harassment

An act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at workplace and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for the matters connected there with or incidental there to whereas sexual harassment result in violation the fundamental right of a women to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment. Where as the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international convention and instruments such as convention on the elimination of all forms of discrimination against women, which has been ratified on the 25th june 1993 by the Government of India. The same act of parliament received the assent of the president on 22nd April 2013 and is hereby published for general information .

"THE SEXUAL HARASSMENT OF WOMEN AT WORK PLACE [PREVENTION, PROHIBITION AND REDRESSAL] ACT, 2013"(NO.140F2013)

As per rules and regulation the "Internal Complaints Committee" is formed to solve the problems of girl students and women at work place under the title "above said act. The committee has six members, four female members and two male members. The president is selected among them.

The committee conducts various programmers for girl students and female faculty members. Such as lecture on 'Tarunyachya umberthyavar', workshop on prevention of sexual harassment of women at workplace by advocate B. K.KHEDKAR. Programmers are conducted such as lathi-Kathi, Jodo for self-defense for girl students, Suraj Gurav DYSP Shahuwadi taluka, delivered a speech and guided women about their rights. Seminar and group discussion on 'Lek Vachava Lek Shikava'is arranged.

- 11. All the college committees allow resources for non –academic activities for student on gender neutral basis.
- 12. Enrollment of female students shows that the dream of founder President of the institution Hon. Dr.K.S.Chougule, to open the college specially for girlsis fulfilled.
- 13. The college faculty members are encouraged to undertake training for professional development throughout their career.
- 14. Responses of students, faculty, staff, parent and visitors are regularly sought in formal and informal ways. Such responses are audited for gender balance and issues raised in the areas are reported to the administration and are solved immediately.
- 15. The college committee has taken care of health of girls students by arranging health checkup camps.
- 16. Gender balance is not maintained in the recruitment of administrative staff.
